
North America: National Park Project (100 Points)

**Directions:** The purpose of this project is to practice and apply the real-world skills of research, planning, and reporting. You will research a national park and report on the location of the place, the logistics of getting there, and characteristics of the place, all the while using geographical skills you have learned, such as absolute location, scale, and knowledge of the themes. As you research, you will figure out how to get to the park, how long it will take, and how much it will cost. Throughout the project, your best researching, reading, and writing skills will be necessary. We will primarily use the Internet to complete our research.



General Requirements: You may pick any park you wish, though your starting point (also your choice) must be AT LEAST 500 miles away from the park you choose.
